Hurricane Irma: Important Reminders

Due to the inclement weather forecasted with [Hurricane Irma](#), South Carolina Governor Henry McMaster issued a mandatory evacuation order starting yesterday, Saturday, September 9 at 10 a.m. for the following barrier islands in Beaufort County - Daufuskie Island, Fripp Island, Harbour Island, Hilton Head Island, and Hunting Island. Re-entry to the affected barrier islands will be prohibited until the evacuation order is lifted. All other portions of Beaufort County are open. Please note the following important reminders:

- The last ferry run from Daufuskie Island is currently scheduled for 12 noon today, Sunday, September 10, pending weather conditions. Ferry services will be suspended after that time. For more information, visit <http://www.daufuskieislandferry.com> or call 843-940-7704.
- All County government offices will be closed Monday, September 11 and Tuesday, September 12, to include all convenience centers, library branches, and parks and leisure services (PALS) facilities. All County public meetings and other scheduled activities for these days are canceled.
- The [Red Cross](#) will open two local storm shelters for those evacuating the barrier islands. The shelters are scheduled to open today, Sunday, September 10 at 9 a.m. at the following locations:
 - Battery Creek High School located at 1 Blue Dolphin Drive in Burton
 - Bluffton High School located at 12 H. E. McCracken Drive in Bluffton
